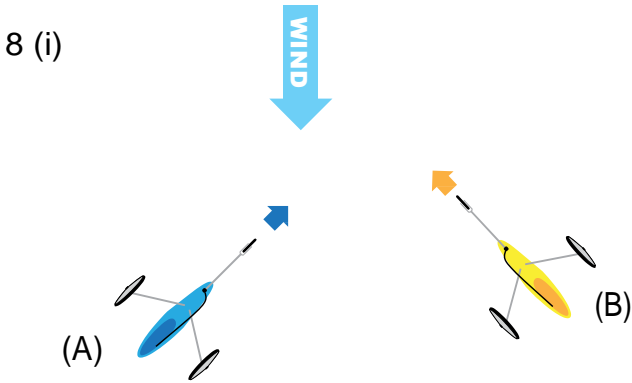

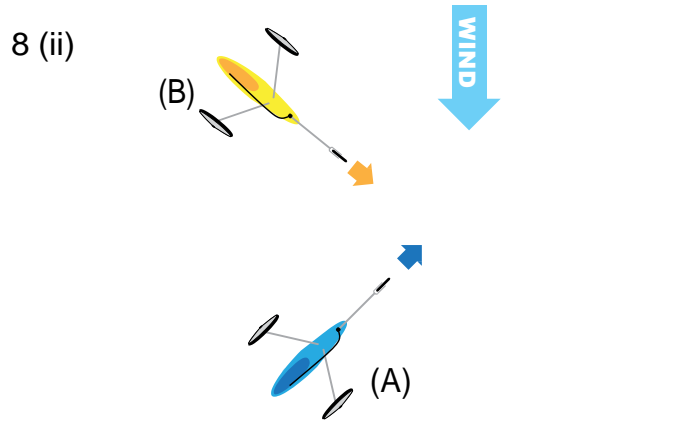



iii) When sufficient experience has been gained, the pilot should be allowed to take part in club racing, after the training officer is satisfied that the trainee is well acquainted with the general sailing rules. It must be remembered the official in charge of the Club racing has the right to exclude trainees from any club race if conditions are not suitable or if the race is of some importance to other pilots.

iv) When the Training Officer is sure that the trainee is ready, he will invite him/her to take the ALYF Test. He will also ask a minimum of three questions on possible incidents which could occur whilst sailing. A pilots licence may be applied for on a satisfactory result of the test.

v) The method of granting licences is based on the ability of the Training Officer to assess correctly the progress of the trainee and the decision is his alone. He must bear in mind the safety aspect and good name of the sport.
